

Internet Use Agreement

When accessing the Library Public Computers, the user is agreeing to the terms and conditions of the Library's Internet Use agreement.

Users should be aware that the inappropriate use of electronic information resources may be in violation of local, provincial and federal laws and can lead to prosecution. The user will be held responsible for his/her actions accessing/using the Internet. Users are expected to abide by the guidelines below. Unacceptable uses of the service will result in the suspension or revocation of Internet use privileges.

Use of the Internet and e-mail is not guaranteed to be private. Messages relating to, or in support of, illegal activities will be reported to the proper authorities.

Guidelines:

- Internet use is offered on a first-come, first-served basis; each user is allowed one session. If there is no patron waiting for the service at the end of a session, the user can have another session.
- Users will respect and uphold all applicable laws and regulations including copyright; they will not access/use library computers for illegal purposes.
- Public internet stations are located in open areas shared by library patrons of all ages, backgrounds and sensibilities, so individual users must be respectful of others while accessing the internet from these workstations. However, due to the open space configuration of the workstations, there can be no expectation of privacy.
- Headphones must be used if listening to any audio materials.
- Users agree not to incur any costs for the library through their use of the Internet service.
- Printing is available at a minimal cost Users shall not deliberately or willfully cause damage or alter computer equipment or programs.
- All computers within the library are unfiltered. It is the responsibility of parents/guardians to monitor and take responsibility for their children's internet and computer use.
- You are responsible for protecting yourself and your data when using the library's computers and wireless network.
